

# William E. Bryant Scholarships



Named for William E. Bryant, 33°, M.S.A., Commander-in-Chief of New Hampshire Consistory for 1999 and 2000, the Scholarship Program provides financial support for the continuing education of New Hampshire Scottish Rite Masons, their family members, and members of Masonic-related youth groups in New Hampshire.

## Eligibility:

To be eligible for the program, applicants must meet any of the following criteria. Be:

- A New Hampshire Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction who is in good standing, or
- A student related to a current or deceased NH Scottish Rite Mason in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, or
- A member of a youth organization in NH, sponsored by the Masonic Fraternity, who is:
  - A high school senior currently accepted at an accredited trade school who has attained a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
  - A high school senior, undergraduate, or graduate student currently enrolled at an accredited college or university.

Applicants will be considered for both the Bryant Scholarship and the Abbott Scholarship. Complete the application on-line. Page 1 (this page) and page 4 are the instruction pages for the application, and do not need to be submitted.

Print five copies of the application, and sign pages 3 and 7 of each copy. Submit all five copies, with the supporting documents to the appropriate Valley Secretary. Applicants should submit the application to the Valley that makes them eligible. (e.g., if a grandfather is providing eligibility, submit the application to his Valley; if qualifying by membership in DeMolay, Rainbow, or Jobs Daughters, submit to the Valley which covers the city or town where that organization meets.)

Applications must be received by the appropriate Valley Secretary by April 15.

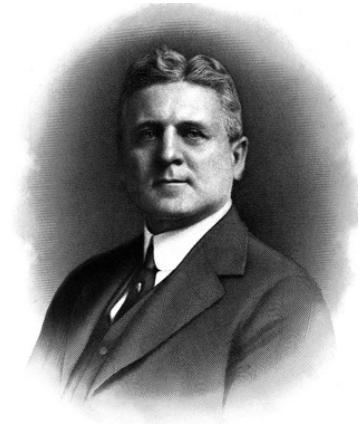

# 2022 Leon M. Abbott Scholarship Application

Named after Leon M. Abbott, Sovereign Grand Commander from 1921 to 1932, the Abbott Scholarship Program provides financial support for the continuing undergraduate and graduate education of Scottish Rite Masons, family members of Scottish Rite Masons and members of Masonic Youth Groups including (but not limited to) the Order of DeMolay, Job's Daughters International and The Order of Rainbow for Girls.



**Eligibility:** Those meeting any of the following criteria are eligible to apply for the 2021 Abbott Scholarship program:

- A Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction who is in good standing.
- A student related (by blood or legal means) to a current or deceased member of the Scottish Rite in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.
- A member of a Masonically sponsored youth group located within the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction (ex - DeMolay International, Job's Daughters, Order of Rainbow for Girls)

To be considered for an Abbott Scholarship, applicants must meet one of the following qualifications (please note that local Valleys may have more strict GPA requirements):

- A high school senior, currently accepted at an accredited trade school who has attained a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
- A high school senior, undergraduate, or graduate student currently enrolled at an accredited college or university.
